I love to turn bowls and hollow forms. I am always experimenting with different techniques, tools, and equipment. The newest thing I am doing is dyeing wood with resin using a vacuum chamber.

My favorite lathe is the Powermatic 3520. Woodturning is very addictive and I use it as a therapeutic method for reducing stress. I have found that when I turn I get lost in the project and you just forget about all the things that stress you out. If you come by my school shop and you find me turning you know I have had a stress filled day.



I have had many mentors that have helped me expand the parameters of my turning and they are: Royal Ritchey, Jack Capps, and Howard King. These are truly some great men and they always seem to find time to answer questions and show me their secrets and techniques.

I originally learned this project from a Richard Raffan book, and it was made similar to a goblet with half the cup cut off with a bandsaw. If you have another way to do it I'd like to see/hear about it. You may feel free to make one any size from tiny to very large.

Looking ahead to **September** the challenge will be "two or more ornaments in different styles." Since our July meeting featured a round-robin with demonstrations of six different designs, you should have something to try. If you don't feel like trying those you can look back at our Christmas tree galleries from previous years.

Restating the topic for **October**: "Something Old, Something New". Do you still have the first bowl you turned or other very early turned item? How would you do it differently now? Bring in your old item along with a new version of the same thing. What if you don't still have or can't find your early pieces? In this case just look around for an old item (bowl, candle-holder, vase, pen, etc.) then see if you can turn a copy or improve on it.

Finally for **November** the topic is "newly turned gift." Here you may do any project you like with the stipulation that you do something intended as a gift, or at least nice enough to be a gift. Just in time for the gift-giving season!

And I'll state again, in case you missed any previous months' challenges, please feel free to do those too. They will count toward the annual total as well. We will award a prize based on participation.
