A few weeks ago I had the good fortune of spending a week at the John C. Campbell Folk School in Brasstown, NC. It was my third trip to the Folk School and I enjoyed every minute of the experience. I spent the week with Don Russell and five other turners as we attempted to produce a sample of Dons' famous Polychromic Urns. To say it was a hectic week would be a mild understatement. It would have been impossible to cut, glue and turn a complete urn in a week so we were able to start with precut and glued up rings. Even starting with the premade

rings, it was a hassle to get each layer glued, turned and added to the next layer which was glued, turned and added to the next layer, which was glued, turned and added to the next layer, etc. I think you are beginning to get the picture. Unlike the other students, I had done three of these urns before. As a matter of fact, the first course Don ever conducted away from his home was for the Alabama Woodturners in 2003. It was a lot of fun then and it still is and when I finish sanding and deciding on the top feature on the three urns I started in the class I'll bring them to Show and Tell. If you have not had an opportunity to take a class at the Folk School, I highly recommend you give it a try. They offer a wide variety of instructors (including our own Pat Johnson) and the facilities are outstanding.



Kudos to Bruce Gibson for his presentation on stool making. I had great faith that he would have some kind of jig incorporated into the presentation and I wasn't disappointed. His method for drilling holes at an angle was novel, fast and relatively easy. The last time I tried to drill holes at an angle involved clamping the piece to the drill press table and adjusting the table angle in an attempt to get the splay right. As I recall, it didn't work, but I thing Bruce's method obviously does. Good show.

This month the pro from Wetumpka will be our guest demonstrator. Pat Johnson (our first Vice President) is not only a very accomplished woodturner but a great teacher as well. I understand he will be demonstrating spindle turning techniques and I'm sure we will all come away with a wealth of information and helpful hints. This is a demonstration you will not want to miss.
