Jigs, Tools and Contraptions you have made

Square Bowl-7" x 7" x 2" or larger

A natural edge piece incorporating a major flaw in the wood

July-Done!

Matched or complimentary pair of candle sticks, one at least 6" high

August

Pepper mill in memory of Karl's Harper's birthday

September

Thin-walled bowl-4" or more in diameter by 1/8" or less thick

October

Christmas Ornaments

November

Lidded box with 'pop' top-1" or more in diameter

FINISHING LACQUER By Keith Rueckert

- Sand turned piece to 400 grit
- Apply Sanding Sealer. Allow to dry.
- Sand again to 400 grit.
- Spray numerous coats of lacquer over a period of at least 4 days.
- Allow lacquer to cure (48 hours). Wet sand with water with 320 and 400 grit to remove all 'orange peel' and any runs. If during sanding, you go through the lacquer, repeat Steps 4 and 5.
- Wipe mineral oil on piece by hand. Using mineral oil and pumice (#2 medium coarse), apply and buff with sheepskin pads. Wipe piece clean with mineral oil on a paper towel.
- Repeat Step 6 using pumice (#4 fine).
- Repeat Step 6 using rottenstone. Wipe piece clean with a paper towel; then wipe with damp (denatured alcohol) paper towel. Polish with dry paper towel.
- Apply 3 drops Finesse-It II (3M product) to designated sheepskin pad and buff piece to a high luster. Wipe clean with paper towel or, preferably, an old t-shirt.

Note:

Use a different designated pad for each procedure-4 pads total.

These steps may be done with piece on the lathe and turning slowly. Sheepskin pads should be rotating so as to eliminate radial marking of the turned piece.

Use some degree of pressure when applying Finesse-It II. Use similar to car wax, buffing till white film disappears. Use a toothbrush and water to remove any white residue from cracks or holes.
