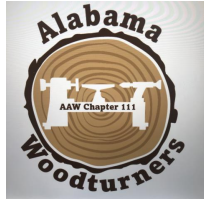


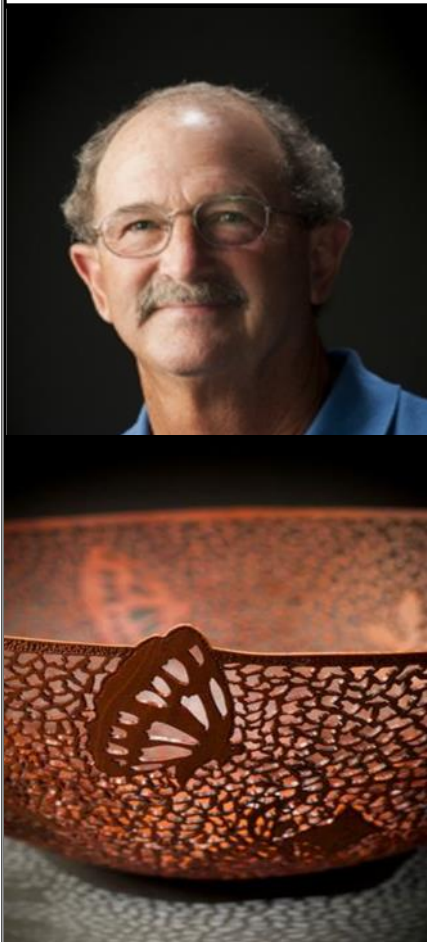

President's Note

I recently attended the Tennessee Association of Woodturners Symposium beginning Friday, January 24th, in Franklin. It was a great event with talented presenters, and I was pleased to represent the AAW along with around a dozen of your fellow members. I believe they had close to 400 attendees and 20 vendors, including our own Pete and Michelle Marken.

As part of the Symposium, AAW Executive Director Phil McDonald was in attendance to encourage folks to sign up for AAW membership. He also held a Chapter Officer discussion where he brought up the following points:

- The AAW has a new website with more functionality.
- New (or former members) can have a free three-month trial AAW membership.
- The AAW 2020 Symposium is set for June 4th-7th in Louisville, Kentucky. If the club can get 10 members to pay by check before April 1, each member will receive a \$25 discount off the normal \$325 advance registration fee. If you are interested, please see me or another officer so we can add your name to the list.

After Phil shared AAW news, he held an informal discussion with the handful of officers in attendance. A few of the points made by the attendees included:

- AAW should provide more support to clubs in areas like promotional materials, logo items, and basically provide access to any specialty items needed to promote the chapter on a local level.
- AAW's new website should allow creating a user-specific experience (i.e., you log in and see all the upcoming events for clubs in adjoining states).
- AAW should investigate certifying selected YouTube videos as AAW Approved if all safety concerns and practices have been met.

If you've never attended a symposium, please consider it. There's no better way to immerse yourself in woodturning for a couple of days and I've yet to find anyone who doesn't come back with at least one or two new tricks, tools, or techniques to try. The other benefit is spending a couple of days with other folks from the club as well as meeting members of other clubs. I can guarantee you'll arrive back home reenergized to turn something; be it a totally new item or just turning the same items better!

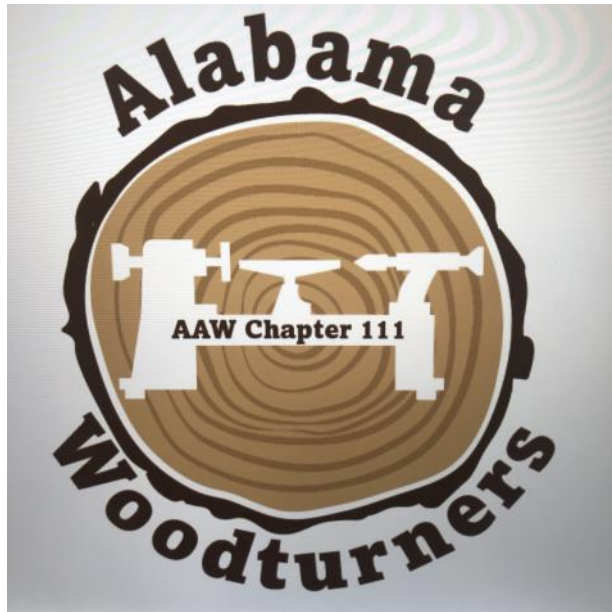
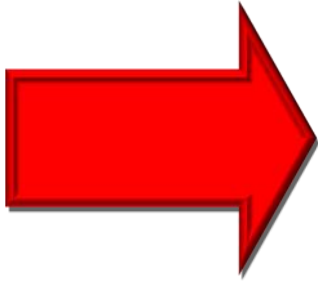

Silent Auction of Lathe, Chucks, and Accessories

Record Power Chucks and Accessories

All the following Record Power items were generously donated by Woodcraft. The M33x3.5 female thread directly fits a One-Way lathe, but also, adapters for other spindle sizes can be found on the internet (\$20-70). Note: Record Power chucks and jaws are fully compatible with Nova and Sorby Patriot chucks and jaws.

Rikon Lathe Model 70-100

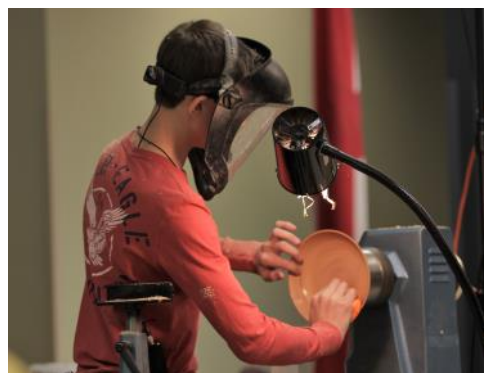
This Rikon mini lathe model 70-100 has been used in our training classes for several years, but only one day per month, so relatively little mileage! Phil has inspected and tuned it to be sure it is in fine working order. This model has a 12" swing x 16" turn-able length, one-half HP motor, and 6 speed settings 430-3900. A new one costs \$499 at Woodcraft.

Estate Inventory and Assessment
