Recap May Demo: "Colouring" by Ed Pretty

Ed came to us from near Vancouver, Canada to teach us colouring (as spelled in Canada). He started with a slide show of his own work and used those pieces to explain techniques and colors used.

He only uses figured wood such as burl, curly, fiddle-back, etc., because the mixture of side grain and end grain add much interest. End grain will absorb dye while side grain does not.

Ed recommends a dye product called Procion MX which is compatible with wood fibers and is color-fast. He advises against stains and inks which block light and may not be color-fast. For black he recommends ColorFX in the small sample size; a little goes a long way. He uses only primary colors red, yellow, and blue. He does not mix the different color dyes but may use a tiny bit of black to darken a color. He applies the primary colors in layers to obtain other colors (orange, green, purple, etc). A variety of colors and shades add much interest to a piece. After the colors have dried the piece will look dull, but a high-gloss finish will bring out the spectacular effect.

Ed talked about bleaching (do not use household chlorine bleach). The lightened wood will brighten colors applied. Ed also explained ebonizing where iron reacts with tannin in wood to darken it, or using ammonia fumes.

Finally he demonstrated liming. For this you need open-pore wood such as oak, hickory, and ash. After turning and sanding to the final grit, apply the liming wax but do not use a steel bristle brush which will scratch the wood.

Suggestions included first and foremost to turn them to a consistent thickness, so that one portion of the turning is not creating more stress on thinner portions. Also putting the items in a paper bag and rolling up the open end will create a microenvironment where it will dry evenly and at a slow pace as the air is saturated with moisture.


