

### Our Demonstrator for April is Mark Sillay



Mark Sillay began woodworking when he was six years old. His father gave him a set of hand tools, an old packing box with a vise mounted on it for a workbench and scrap wood. Then his father, with patience and loving instruction, continued to guide him throughout his youthful years,. From that, he grew to appreciate tool skills, freedom of design and superior quality finish work.

Mr. Sillay attributes his love for woodturning to Cindy Drozda, who helped him transform his woodturning life into a joyful journey. Having made many basic bowls, Mark has turned his focus to creating finer turned objects.

Mr. Sillay finds satisfaction in both the creative process and in overcoming the challenges to complete fine quality finished work. He specializes in using a razor sharp spindle gouge and watching the shapes evolve while he is creating intricate turnings.

In our meeting, Mark will demonstrate his technique of wood slicing, a technique which keeps him from ever having to use sandpaper to get a smooth finish. He will demonstrate the five basic cuts using this technique and will be teaching this technique in the afternoon class.

Mark is also going to be bringing exotic woods, in case someone would like to purchase wood like Norfolk Island Pine, etc. He is a member of West Georgia

Woodturners and the American Association of Woodturners. He travels all over the United States giving demos, and has numerous You Tube videos on woodturning.

AWA gives a birthday gift door prize to a turner who has a birthday during the month of that meeting. Here are the 'rules' for this year:


- 1) This is a door prize so, yes, you need to be at the meeting and stay for the drawing to win.






